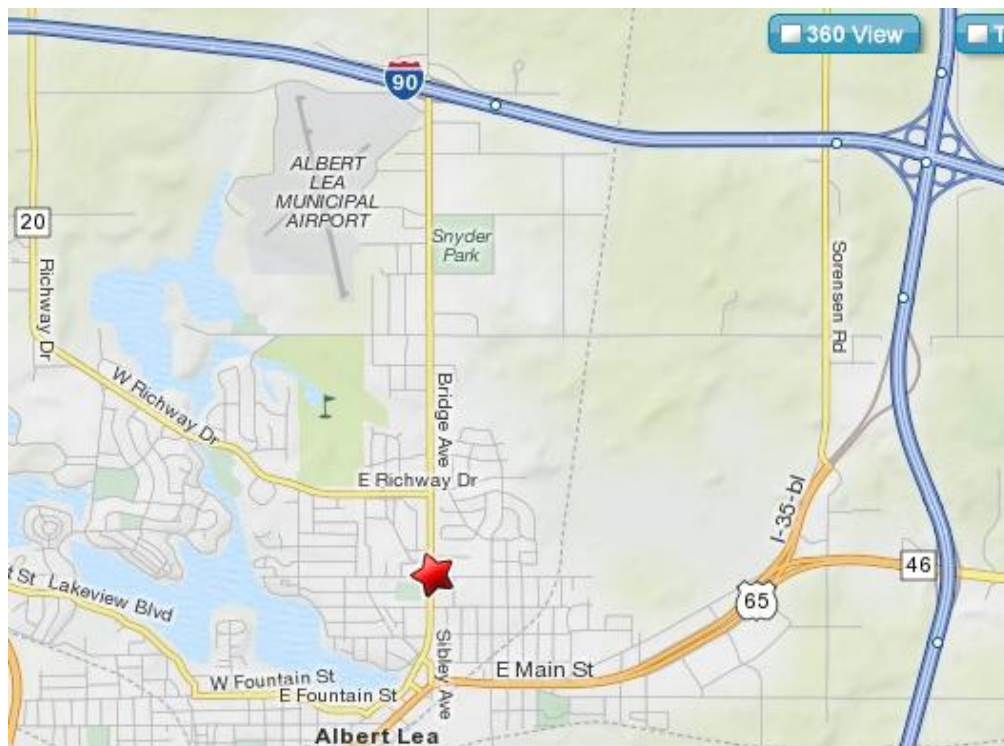
March 12th, 2011 General Meeting Held at the Freeborn County Fairgrounds, Albert Lea Minnesota.

An agenda was presented with revisions presented by Bob Koepp. A motion was made by Dave Kanten, seconded by Werner Reining and approved to accept the revised agenda. A motion was made by Bob Koepp, seconded by Kathy Eckstrand and approved to accept the secretary's report as printed in the last newsletter.

Nathan Hanson gave a recap of the treasurer's report \$ 33,000 total; \$5,000 savings, \$16,000 RPRU, and \$12,000 in the general account. A motion was made by Werner Reining, seconded by Bob Koepp, and approved to accept the report as presented. It was noted that only 20% of the total is due when ordering toys.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT: Jerry Bambenek reported that there are over 350 members. Two are complimentary memberships. A membership form will be added to the exhibitors packet.

MERCHANDISE REPORT: Linda Klein reported that Red Wing Pottery was ordered. Pre orders for pick up at the show will be accepted. Other items to be ordered: polo shirts, hats, tank tops, t shirts, Cub Cadet caps, and Scout caps.

BELT BUCKLE REPORT: Orders are being recorded as they are received and money being put on deposit.

AUCTION REPORT: Roger Seimsen reported that auctioneer Cary Aasness would like to limit the auction to 2 ½ hours which would allow for a maximum of 75-80 units. There are currently 60 tractors listed. All units must run.

VENDOR REPORT: Bill Radil reports that 18 inside vendors have reserved 88 spaces, and 6 outside vendors have 485 spaces. The Lions club building would be available for a donation to the Club.

CAMPING REPORT: Dave Kanten reports that full hook up sites are full. Extra primitive camping has been made available.

CHAPTER REGISTRATION: Kathy Eckstrand has sent 30 registration forms and received 8 responses. The Wells family is working on table toppers.

TRACTOR REGISTRATION: Mel Melcher is handling mailed registrations, Conrad Fiskness made up a pre-registration form and will handle on-line reservations.

TOY REPORT: Eric Koepp reports that Scale Model can do a 1/16 scale Cub Cadet that would be imprinted with RPRU and would be available to Chapter 15 for purchase at RPRU at a selling price of \$78.95. Also available would be the 826 and Cub Cadet Pedal tractors at a selling price of \$225.00. Could be drop shipped after the show \$25-\$30. An 826 1/8 scale is available. Eric will get minimum quantities before the December meeting. The order deadline is March 1 2010.

ADVERTISING: ¼ page ads will be put in Farm Collector and Antique Power.

POSTERS: We will have a full page in the Albert Lea Convention Bureau Brochure at a cost of \$1150. \$1000 of that total is being covered by a grant from the Visitors Bureau.

MOTEL: Bruce Jensen has located 1100 more rooms in surrounding cities in Minnesota and Iowa. Names and numbers will be posted on the Web.

From the Collectors Corner

As I am writing the weather people are saying that we have had as much snow already this winter as we normally get all year. Well, it is just mid-January so there is more winter to come and I don't even need a groundhog to tell me that. We did have a short early January break by flying to Florida for a week to visit a brother in the Fort Myers area. We had a great time and following is a recap of a trip highlight.

On the first Friday of January, we drove up to Leesburg, FL to visit one of the IH museums listed in Harvester Highlights. Stew Paquette has developed quite a collection that he calls Stew's IH Stuff. He features IH tractors from 1939 to 1985 and it is a collection that started with a pulling tractor he purchased in Canada several years ago.

On the sprawling campus of his "Buffalo Nickel Ranch" he has amassed a collection of over 100 tractors plus many implements and IH memorabilia. You start by entering a replica of an IH dealership of the 50's and 60's. It is full of all sorts of typical IH items and behind the showroom is a very neat and fully equipped shop. This shop is staffed by a full-time mechanic who was busily restoring a "C" while we were there. He has a large "Show Barn" equipped with a stage and electronic gear to show videos, movies plus much more memorabilia, pictures and collectibles. Then you go to the "Tractor Barn" which is a 50' X 250' building full of beautifully restored tractors and trucks. He has some tractors that were of very limited production.

Imagine our delight to discover that besides Stew waiting to greet us (I had called ahead to verify that they were open) was a Chapter 15 member. Bruce Clementson from Pine Island winters in the Leesburg area and spends considerable time with Stew at the museum helping guide visitors and with many other details. I first met Bruce at the "Field of M's" feature in Le Sueur in 2008. Bruce had one of his 1939 "M's" at the show. He has since sold one '39 "M" to Stew and it is on display outside of the "Tractor Barn". We were there almost four hours and Bruce walked around with us the whole time. Stew and his office manager, Michelle, together with Bruce, made us feel very welcome and provided us with the highlight event of our Florida visit.

Stew has a large pond in front of the buildings and there to my surprise was a pair of Sand Hill cranes walking around. This museum is growing too. Stew has poured the slab for a 110' X 200" building that will add to his capability for storing IH products. "Stew's Stuff" Museum will only get bigger and better. Even the ladies in our group enjoyed the visit and their enjoyment was enhanced by the discovery of a quilt shop in the town of Leesburg. I'm not as dumb as some might think, so we tore ourselves away from all the tractors in time to give the ladies a chance to add to their fabric stash. It was a good thing that we were flying which created a limit on the amount of fabric that could be brought back to Minnesota.

I took a bunch of pictures and it is too bad this isn't a color tabloid type of newsletter. But Stew's Stuff was featured in the January-February issue of Antique Power and that four page article has many pictures. Better yet, get out of the snow, fly or drive to Florida and see it all for yourself. I am sure Stew would be delighted to have you visit.

In the last issue I mentioned I was looking for a 7 foot sickle mower and a 2000 loader. Well, I now have the mower and have also found a loader that I will pick up when the snow has melted. The mower needed a bit of modification to the power takeoff shaft and club member Rick Bodin gave me some help with that. It is great having good friends in the club! Thanks to everyone who contacted me with offers and/or tips on where to find these items. Apparently people do read this column!

Next up is the March meeting and hopefully we will all see each other there.

12-04-10 Annual meeting IHCC Chapter #15 Arlington MN

President Bruce Jensen called the meeting to order at 12:30 pm. All board members were present with the exception of George Weitgenant, Werner Reining, and Dave Kanten. A motion was made seconded and approved to accept the agenda as presented. The secretary's report was corrected to remove Sandy Pearson as contact for the Wright County Show, and replace with Richard Bodin. A motion was made by Paul Adelman seconded by Bill Radil and approved to approve the Secretary's report as printed in the newsletter with the above corrections. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the Treasurer's report as presented by Nathan Hanson. Balance on hand is \$27,000.

Guests and new members were recognized. A group from Wright County Fair was present. Membership secretary Jerry Bambenek reported that we have 340 members. There were 32 new members in 2010 with 28 who did not renew. Conrad Fiskness will head registration for exhibitors. Registrations can be e-mailed to Conrad, or mailed to Mel Melcher. He asked all exhibitors or vendors from the 2010 Scott Carver show to see Bob Watkins for show plaques if they did not get one. Conrad explained and apologized for the Link-n e-mails to all on his distribution list.

Bruce Jensen has a new e-mail address bejensen@gmail.com. He attended a meeting in Iowa and learned to use an agenda for meetings. He learned that 2011 is also the 50th anniversary of the Scout. We will recognize the 50th anniversary of Scout and Cub Cadet as part of our Red Power Round Up. John Neville was the IH rep for the Cyclo Corn planter. There are some pieces of the original planter still in existence. We will try to locate them.

Linda Klein gave a merchandise report. She has an order form for RPRU Red Wing Pottery: She ordered 250 pitchers, 250 banks, and 100 batter bowl. The selling price will be \$26.50 pitcher, \$22.50 bank, and \$59.00 for the batter bowl with 2 lb pancake mix. She also ordered 5 numbered one gallon croaks with lids to be auctioned after the show. She will order Cub Cadet caps, Scout caps, and RPRU caps. RPRU polo shirts for men and women are available for sale. Also available are women's vests, and winter coats with a sale price of \$50.00.

Eric Koepp has brought Toy Collector magazines to share with anyone who wants one. Al Rodenwald is looking for some January 2010 issues of Harvester Highlights if anyone has an extra, see Al. The group from Wright County Fair reports that they have 60 acres of ground. In 2010 they hosted the Minneapolis Moline national show with up to 250 exhibits. 2010 they will host J I Case, and in 2012 IHC. The fair starts the first Wednesday in August and lasts for 5 days. We would be welcome to be there for all days or from Thursday through Saturday. They will furnish a 40X100 tent for our use. They have on site trailer and truck parking, and 24 hour security. There is primitive camping available on the grounds and 7 motels in the area. They also have a 50X100 hoop building that would be available. We can sell merchandise without paying a vendor fee. There are people movers and there will be a parade every day.

There is an open motion that was made seconded and tabled at an earlier meeting to accept the offer to have our state show in conjunction with the Wright County Fair in 2012. The motion was passed. Chapter directors up for election are Dave Kanten, Joel Klein, and Bob Koepp. All have agreed to serve another term. Nominations were asked from the floor three times. A motion was made by Mel Melcher, seconded by Linda Klein, and approved to close the nominations. A motion was made by Gale Suter, seconded, and passed to unanimously approve the reelection of the three directors. Jim Brewer representing South Dakota Chapter 15 indicated they will be bidding on Red Power Round up 2014 and asked for our support.

RED POWER ROUND UP COMMITTEE REPORTS

TOY COMMITTEE: Eric Koepp reported that the quantities required for toy orders are 500 for the 1/16 826, 250 for the Cub Cadet Pedal tractor, and unspecified for the 1/8 scale Cub Cadet.

A motion was made by Bill Radil, and Seconded by Gilbert Dick to purchase the minimum quantities required for ordering. Discussion followed with Sandy Pearson making a motion to amend the motion limiting quantities to 500 1/16 scale 826 gold demonstrators, the purchase of 9 856 pedal tractors from existing stock (Roger Seimsen will donate 1 additional), and 50 1/8 Cub Cadet tractors. The motion to amend was seconded by Linda Klein. More discussion followed. Jerry Bambenek called for a vote. The motion as amended was passed to purchase 250 1/16 Gold 826, 9 826 Gold Pedal tractors, and 50 1-8 scale Cub Cadets. The pedal tractors will be used for children's activities and auctioned at the end of the show.

RPRU TRACTOR RESTORATION: Lee Sackett will do final restoration of a McCormick 1020 at the show.

TRACTOR AUCTION: Roger Seimsen reports that auctioneer Cary Aasness currently has 60 tractors on consignment.

BELT BUCKLE: Rod Larson reports that 600 were ordered and 140 have been sold.

VENDOR REPORT: Bill Radil reports that 20 inside vendors have reserved 90 spaces, and 6 outside vendors have reserved 485' of space.

CAMPING REPORT: Dave Kanten is absent due to weather. Bruce Jensen reports that 100 additional primitive sites are available, and there is additional parking available for semis and trailers.

CHAPTER REGISTRATION: Kathy Eckstrand sent out 31 registration forms and has 8 confirmations. Marilyn Wells and her daughter Eileen showed the table decorations they are making for each chapter. A quilted table mat with a red pot of geraniums will be made for each table.

TRACTOR REGISTRATIONS: Conrad Fiskness will handle e-mail registrations with Mel Melcher handling mailed registrations. Orville Deling will assist as needed.

ADVERTISING: Bruce Jensen reports that the poster has been updated, and the ALCVB brochure is ready for distribution

MOTEL: Additional motel rooms have been located and will be added to the web site.

NEWSPAPER REPORT: The Albert Lea Tribune will publish the show newspaper. The contact there is Scott Schmetzer.

CUB CADET: The committee will be headed by Randy Benson with assistance from Oran Modine, and Hugh Simon. The donation of a new Cub Cadet with a drive shaft has been promised by MTD.

MINNESOTA CONNECTION: Arnold Zempel reports there is a early Stieger, an original skid steer loader, and a cyclo planter prototype that may be available.

SHOW BOOK COMMITTEE: George and Sharon Weitgenant are working on this.

Ken Eckstrand reports that he is working on putting a tour package together.

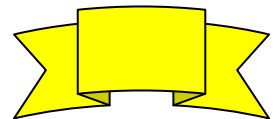
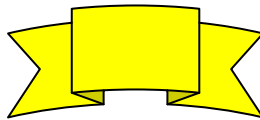
